





PLEASE REMEMBER DESERT ARC IN YOUR WILL Dear Friends,

Desert Arc's past fiscal year, bridging July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, marked an out of the ordinary 12 months of operations during a global pandemic for our 62-year-old, nonprofit human services agency.

An overriding focus for everyone involved was to stay on the pulse of the ever-changing COVID-19 national and local public safety mandates and guidelines. I'm proud to report that Desert Arc adeptly handled every change and pivoted to meet each challenge inspired by a deep commitment to our cause. And, best of all, Desert Arc was able to continue to provide programs and services to our clients, the 683 people with intellectual and development disabilities served by our mission, albeit mostly virtual.

Our Program staff were in constant contact with our clients and Desert Arc's Transportation team and fleet of buses were repurposed to deliver food, equipment and supplies like iPads and art materials to each person at their place of residence. Plus, FYI–For Your Independence staff continued to visit clients at their homes throughout the pandemic with ppe protocols in place. The essential Business Services crews – Janitorial, Landscape Maintenance, Shredding and Recycling remained in full force in the community, as did our on-site Fulfillment division.

Of note, Desert Arc did not hold our two annual fundraising events, the *Champions of Change* Recognition Awards Luncheon and the Golf Classic, because of COVID-19 and our overarching concern for everyone's safety. However, we look forward to the promise of resuming these in the future!

My deepest gratitude for the unwavering dedication of Desert Arc's Board of Directors, staff and all of our supporters in making a difference in the lives of people with disabilities!









LENGTH OF TIME IN PROGRAM






